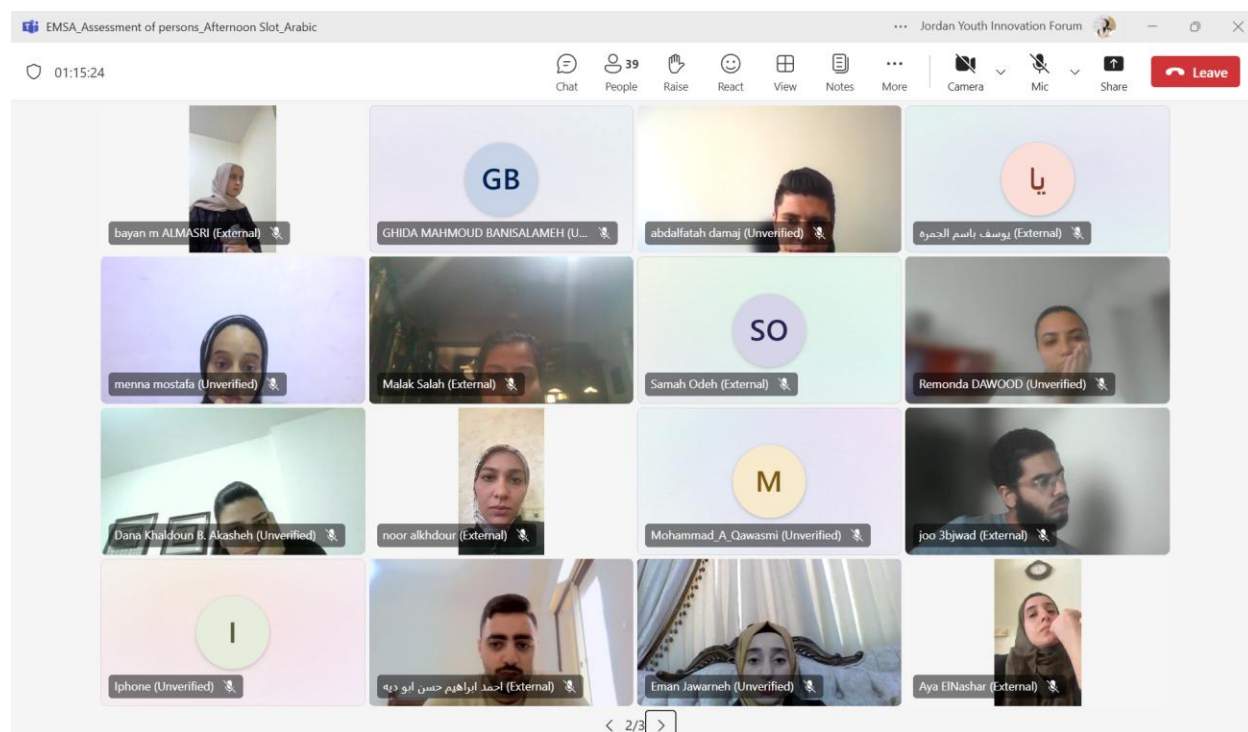

7th Press Release – Implementation of the Assessment of EntreComp and ERF Competences

The EMSA Project (“Joined Development, Piloting and Validation of Entrepreneurial Mindset and Key Skills Curricula and Training Materials for Third Countries”) has successfully implemented the assessment phase for the EntreComp competences and is currently conducting the assessment for the ERF competences, marking a key step toward the validation and certification of learners’ entrepreneurial and key skills.



EntreComp Assessment – Entrepreneurial Mindset

The EntreComp assessment evaluates entrepreneurial knowledge and mindset through a digital examination based on a pool of 225 questions, developed by M.M.C. Management Center Ltd (Cyprus), DIMITRA Educational Organisation (Greece), Have a Dream (Egypt), Jordan Youth Innovation Forum (Jordan), and the Arab College of Applied Sciences (Palestine).

Each participant receives 60 randomly selected questions. The tool is certified by the Cyprus Certification Company (CCC) under ISO 17024 standards and conducted online via the LMS platform:

Registration and prior approval are required. Participants must have completed compulsory education and hold a degree at least at EQF Level 5 in any field.

Results: 66 participants have taken the EntreComp exam, and 53 have successfully completed it.

ERF Assessment – Key Competences

The ERF assessment measures transversal skills following the European Reference Framework for Key Competences. A pool of 120 questions was developed, with 24 questions randomly selected for each digital test.

Questions include both knowledge-based and scenario-based formats, ensuring a balanced evaluation of theory and practice. The assessment is available in Arabic, Greek, and English through the same online platform.

Results: 9 participants have successfully completed the ERF exam, and the next session is scheduled for 31 October, with a high number of participants expected.



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
